

School Uniform



We believe that pupils really feel a sense of belonging by wearing a uniform, they take greater pride not only in themselves, but in their learning within the School. We do, therefore, have a School Uniform (all of which should be named) which consists of the following:-

Reception pupils:

As for other children *except* that both boys and girls may choose to have polo shirts only (not button through shirts/blouses). They do not need to have ties.

Unless the children can tie them independently, they should not have laced shoes.

Years 1 and 2 are welcome to start wearing shirts and ties.

Year 3 and above should wear long or short sleeved cotton shirts with the school tie. Shirts must be tucked in and top buttons done up.

All garments of the uniform are readily available from most high street stores, although items bearing the school badge are available from Graduates in Orpington High Street.

Art and Craft:

Protective clothing – art aprons with sleeves can be purchased but an old shirt would suffice.

PE, Games Lessons and swimming:

A named PE bag (available from the School & Home Association via the school office) in which to put the following:

Red shorts and white T shirt OR
White shorts and red T shirt
Black or white slip on plimsolls

For outdoor games lessons, children may wear a **plain** navy tracksuit (no logos)
(tracksuit with red piping available from Graduates).

When swimming, we ask that pupils wear 'regulation' swimwear (not bikini/long shorts, etc) and a swim hat – hats are available from the SHA via the school office

The covered pool where pupils swim in the summer term.



Items NOT suitable:

TRAINERS for indoors apparatus as the stiff sole prevents gripping.

EARRINGS can be especially dangerous and **ONLY** small studs in the earlobe are acceptable to wear to school. These are to be removed by children during PE lessons. We ask that pupils do not have ears pierced during term time, as earrings have to remain in for 6 weeks and this is not suitable for swimming, games etc.
